### *from the Vice-Chancellor Desk*

Dear Readers,

Greetings from Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University!!!

September is a month of retreating monsoon. This year fortunately we had average rainfall in Bihar and adjoining areas. Bihar has lot of Diyara and other low land areas where rainwater is stored. Since past two years Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University, Pusa is taking all efforts to utilise these areas for fish farming and getting success in it.

Post-harvest fish losses are a major concern for us. In fact this occurs in most fish distribution chains throughout the world. Not only do losses constitute loss in income to fishermen, processors and traders but they also contribute to food insecurity – a loss of fish means less fish available for the consumer. Assessing losses and understanding them is important to address the post-harvest fish loss problem. College of Fisheries, Dholi organised an awareness programme on “Recent Advances in Fish Harvest and Post-harvest Technology” to provide Fisheries Extension Officers and development practitioners an effective fieldwork tool that can be facilitated to the fishers and traders to safeguard them. This awareness programme was not only designed as a definitive guide to fish loss assessment but rather as a resource that can encourage greater efforts to understand the problem and reduce losses. Different types of fish by-products like fish pickle, fish finger, fish fillet and fish ball were prepared and demonstrated during this programme. Various types of fishing gears were also displayed and working principle were demonstrated.

From this year we have started centralised admission system to make the whole admission process student centric. In this system the admission procedure which includes certificate verification, fee deposit, and others have been centralised. Students are not required to move from one department to other. All the procedure gets completed at one place in a single window system and students are allotted hostel as well, at the spot. Some other facilities like mobile sim card were also made available at the spot. I congratulate Dr. Ravinandan, Registrar, Dr. M. N. Jha, Director (Edu) and his team for his untiring efforts for implementing this system. It has also come to my notice that this year students from different states with higher rank opted for admission in Dr RPCAU. We are trying hard to raise the academic level of University and make the University from teacher centric to student centric one; likewise, from scientist centric to farmer centric. You will find various reports of activities in brief in this newsletter. I hope you will enjoy reading.
